Year of the Sunflower

The Sunflower is one of the most popular genera of flowers to grow in your garden.

First-time to experienced gardeners gravitate to these bold, easy to grow flowers.

Sunflowers originated in the Americas and domestic seeds dating back to 2100 BC have been found in Mexico. Native Americans grew sunflowers as a crop, and explorers eventually brought the flowers to Europe in the 1500s. Over the next few centuries, sunflowers became increasingly popular on the European and Asian continent, with Russian farmers growing over 2 million acres in the early 19th century (most of which was used to manufacture sunflower oil).

How to Grow and Care for Sunflowers:

Sunflower seeds can be direct sown after the risk of frost has passed or started indoors. Seeds should be sown ¼" to ½" deep and kept moist. Taller, larger sunflower varieties have a large taproot to keep them rooted and do not do well when they are transplanted so direct sowing of those varieties is recommended. Choose a site, or a container, in full sun, with average fertility and good drainage.



Prune lightly after flowering to maintain shape and extend the life span of the plant.





Marigold 'Vanilla Cream'

Alumia Vanilla Cream is a new French marigold with large, very early blooming 2½ in. soft lemon yellow, anemone-type flowers. Plants are vigorous and branching to 10-12 in. tall, with a slightly wider spread. Alumia Vanilla Cream is a Fleuroselect Novelty Award winner.

Petchoa (Petunia x Calibrachoa)

Petchoas are beautiful sun-loving annual flowers for sun. They're relatively new plants on the market, so a lot of gardeners haven't heard of them before. Grow petchoas and you can be a trend setter! These flowers are gaining popularity because they're easy to grow and offer beautiful petunia-like flowers in a stunning range of colors. Happily, they don't suffer from some of the problems that their old-fashioned cousins do.

Most petchoa varieties have a mounding or trailing shape, making them versatile and perfect for both container gardens and landscaping. In pots, use them as lovely filler plants to add color and texture, or as spiller plants, to cascade over the side of the container. You can also use them to perfect effect in hanging baskets.

Grow petchoas in full sun (at least six to eight hours of direct light a day). They can tolerate some partial shade, but they won't bloom as well and are more likely to get lanky, unattractive stems without enough sun. Like most flowering annuals (including petunias and calibrachoas, to which they're related), petchoas prefer moist, well-drained soil rich in organic matter if you grow them in gardens. In containers, choose a potting mix designed for use in pots. Water them regularly to keep them from wilting -- but take care not to overwater. The soil should never stay wet or soggy, otherwise the roots could rot.

Fertilize petchoas regularly during the growing season or make it easy on yourself and use a slow-release fertilizer at planting time. Slow-release fertilizers deliver a little bit of nutrients to the soil each time you water and you only need to apply them once a season.

You typically don't need to worry about pinching or pruning petchoas to keep them pretty, through you can if you'd like to encourage more compact growth.



AAS Judges noted how this rudbeckia was earlier to flower than the comparisons and lasted throughout the summer providing weeks of stunning color in the garden. Large 4-6" blooms cover compact 12-18" plants that are sure to be a "WOW" factor in any garden.

Amarillo Gold is also the recipient of the Fleuroselect Gold Medal award for performance in European trials.



Senecio 'Angel Wings'

A striking new Senecio with the beautiful name "Angel Wings". Angel Wings has silky, silvery white foliage and is a perfect plant for indoors as well as outdoors. Beautiful to use for mixed containers or as a solitary on patio or balcony. The habit is medium and Angel Wings grows to 10-12" tall and 10" wide. Plant Angel Wings in the sun in an acidic, neutral or alkaline soil. This fast growing Senecio is drought and salt tolerant.

2021 Edible of the Year: Garden Bean

There are many species of beans in cultivation around the world, yet it is the common garden bean, Phaseolus vulgaris that takes on celebrity status as National Garden Bureau's vegetable focus for 2021.

One of the earliest cultivated plants, garden beans can trace their beginnings to Central and South America. Vining or climbing beans were an original member of the "Three-Sisters" - a companion planting of the first domesticated crops of maize, winter squash, and climbing beans. These became the three main agricultural crops used for trade and food for Native North Americans.

Green beans were once referred to as string beans due to the long fibrous thread along the pod seams. The first stringless green bean was developed in 1894 by Calvin Keeney who later became known as the "Father of the stringless bean". Breeders continue to breed this stringless trait into modern genetics. Other desirable traits include dark green succulent pods, good bean flavor, concentrated fruit set, stress tolerance, and disease resistance.

Basic Types of Garden Beans:

The common garden bean is anything but common! Green beans or 'snap' beans as they are also referred to come in a variety of slavors, pod shapes, sizes, and a colorful pallet including shades of green, purple, yellow, and speckled bicolors.

- Bush beans are the workhorse of the garden and the mainstay in the kitchen. Bush beans are compact and fit well into both small garden patches or patio containers fitted with cages
- Pole beans with their vining habits and can be trained up poles, trellises, netting, or supportive structures such as a teepee. With proper support pole beans can also be grown in containers.
- Filet beans or Haricots Vert (French green beans) are distinguished by elegant ultra-slim pods. Due to their delicate appearance, Filet beans are gaining in popularity with foodies and chefs. Filet beans come in both bush and pole bean types.
- Dried or shelling beans are grown for their edible seeds rather than edible pods. Pinto beans, kidney beans, and black beans fall into this category.

Garden Beans Growing Tips:

- Beans are warm-weather vegetables and are best planted after soil temperatures reach 70F.
- · Avoid sowing too early in the season. Cool wet soils can lead to rot.
- Beans thrive with at least eight hours of daily sun, moderate fertility, and well-drained soil.
- Beans have shallow roots, weed carefully to prevent damage to the root system.
- Mulch the soil around the bean plant; consistent moisture results in the highest quality harvests.
- Quick to mature, harvests can begin 50-60 days after sowing.
- Bush beans typically grow 12 to 24 inches tall and produce harvests for about 3 weeks.
- Succession sowing of bush beans every 2-3 weeks will produce delicious beans all season.
- Pole beans have a long harvest season, generally lasting about six to eight weeks.
- Harvest frequently to encourage pod production.
- Pole beans can quickly grow a lush privacy wall around porches or patios.
- Create a living Fort or Teepee with pole beans for a fun play space.
- Yellow wax beans lack chlorophyll and will retain their beautiful golden color when cooked.
- Purple beans contain anthocyanins (the purple pigment) that disappear when beans are cooked.

Onion 'Red Nugent' & 'Yukon'

An attractive red hybrid with high yield potential that is highly adaptable for diverse soil types. An early maturing, long-day variety bred to perform in sandy and clay loam soils of the Pacifi Northwest U.S. Medium to jumbo sized, globeshaped bulbs have excellent early interior color. Good yield potential. Great for open field and fresh market production. Intermediate resistance to Basal Rot and Pink Root.





Yukon is one of our newest introductions and promises great storage potential. It offers excellent firmness, single centers and sizes from colossal to jumbo. Very grower friendly!

Pepper 'Armageddon'

Armageddon is the world's first F1 super-hot chili measuring at 1.2 million scovilles. This gives a fantastic grower advantage in terms of improved plant vigor, yield and fruit uniformity. It is the earliest maturing super-hot variety, at least 14 days earlier than other super hot peppers. It is similar to Carolina Reaper.





Pepper 'PeppiGrande'

- ► Corno-shaped pepper has outstanding crisp texture, rich flavour and more sweetness than large-fruited peppers.
- ▶ Fruit is often seedless, which means less preparation time for chopping and cooking; great on the grill or baked stuffed with cheese.
- ▶To produce seedless fruit, grow it in isolation from other (non-seedless) pepper varieties.
- ▶If it is not isolated, it will produce larger, great-tasting fruit with just a few seeds.
- Best grown in-ground with support of stakes or a cage.

Pepper 'Lemon Drop'

▶100 days. Seasoning pepper from Peru ripens to a clear lemon yellow, sometimes with a dark purple blush. The flavor is a very clean, uncomplicated, slightly citrusy heat. 2-foot plants are covered with the thin-walled, conical fruit which reaches 2-3 inches in length, with very few seeds.





Pepper 'Pot-a-Peno'

- ▶2021 AAS Edible Vegetable Winner
- ▶Pot-a-peno is a fun new jalapeno pepper with a compact habit perfect for growing in containers and hanging baskets. Plentiful small, green jalapeño fruits have a traditional spicy zip that is great in any dish where you want a little punch of spice. Simply leave the fruit on the vine a few extra weeks and they will ripen to red for a sweet, spicy flavor. This variety is earlier to mature than other jalapenos giving you a head start on your garden's harvest. A unique trait of Pot-apeno is how the fruit hangs down beneath the plant making it very easy to harvest without damaging the appearance or productivity of the plant. A dense foliage canopy makes for an attractive addition to your patio or balcony garden.

Squash 'Goldilocks'

- ▶2021 Edible Vegetable Winner
- ▶Once upon a time, there was an acorn squash named Goldilocks. In summer trials all across North America, the vigorous plant, high yield, disease tolerance, and rich nutty flavor of this variety had our judges saying, "Ahhh, this squash is just right!" like in the fairy tale. The bright orange fruits with uniform shape and color double as an ornamental decoration. Makes a great complement to AAS Winner Honey Bear acorn squash.





Tomato 'Stellar'

- The perfect slicer for areas with high disease pressure.
- ▶ Produces lots of round, red fruit that is perfect for all uses.
- ▶Best in-ground; benefits from trellis for support.

Tomato 'Juliet'

▶ Great flavor, fresh or cooked.

▶A larger sister variety of Santa, Juliet is one of the most disease resistant in our trials. Deep red, shiny fruits avg. 2-2 1/4" x 1 3/8-1 1/2", weighing 1 1/2-2 oz. Typically 12-18 fruits per cluster. Delicious, rich tomato flavor for salads, great salsa, and fresh pasta sauce. Good crack resistance, vine storage, and shelf life. Intermediate resistance to early blight and late blight. AAS winner. Indeterminate.





Tomato 'Chocolate Sprinkles'

- ▶50-55 Days
- ▶ Beautiful, 1-1/2 inch, cherries are red, striped with dark green. Fruits have a rich sweet flavor and grow in trusses of 5 to 7. Produces more fruit with better flavor than similar open pollinated varieties. Very productive and early.
- ▶Indeterminate.

Tomato 'Celano'

- ▶2020 AAS Edible Vegetable Winner
- ► Celano is a patio type grape tomato with a strong bushy habit. It is best grown with some support, such as a tomato cage. This semideterminate hybrid tomato is an early producer of sweet oblong fruits weighing about 0.6 oz. each. Plants grow to 40" in height and spread to 24" and have excellent late blight tolerance. In comparing it to other grape tomatoes on the market, one judge summed it up by saying "(Celano) is sweeter, the texture is better, the color is deeper, the plants are healthier, and the yield is phenomenal." Prova Celano oggi!





Tomato 'Fantastico'

- ▶2014 AAS Edible Vegetable Winner
- Fantastico is a must for any market grower or home gardener looking for an earlymaturing, high-yielding grape tomato with built-in Late Blight Tolerance. Bred for small gardens, determinate Fantastico will work great in hanging baskets, container gardens as well as in small gardens. Long clusters of sweet tasty fruits are held toward the outside of the plant, making them very easy to harvest but if you let them go a few days past peak, these little beauties resist cracking better than the comparisons used in the AAS trials.
- A unique determinate bush tomato with well-flavored half-ounce grape shaped fruit. High yielding plants produce up to 12 pounds of ripe fruit. Best grown in a cage to provide some plant support, but can also be grown in a large patio container or an 18-inch hanging basket.

Tomato 'Heartbreakers Vallery'


The Heartbreakers™ F1 - Vallery has a trailing growth habit, which makes it ideal for large containers and hanging baskets. This variety is suitable for both professional growers under high light intensity and home gardeners. The juicy fruit have a tender skin and the perfect sweet/sour balance with a brix of about 9.




2021 Herb of the Year: Parsley

Parsley is the 2021 Herb of the Year^{\mathbb{M}} of the International Herb Association. It is one of the most familiar of the culinary herbs used for both flavoring and as a garnish.

There are two common types of parsley—the curly variety and flat-leaved variety, also known as Italian parsley (Petroselinum crispum var. neapolitanum).





It is hardy in USDA Hardiness Zones 4 to 9, prefers a sunny to partly sunny and well-drained site. Plants can be grown from seed but because germination is slow, they are often started indoors early, or winter-sown. Many prefer to purchase starter plants. Plant them 8-10 inches apart near the last frost date for your area. A member of the same family as dill, parsley has a long tap root and, once established, does not transplant well.

Harvest parsley throughout the growing season by cutting stems at the bottom. Harvest in the morning after the dew has dried but before the heat of the day softens the leaves. Upright sprigs can be held fresh in water for several days. To dry small amounts, first wash and gently pat dry. Strip the leaves from the stems and dry on a screen or paper towels, taking care that the leaves do not touch. Conversely, gather a small number of sprigs together, secure with a rubber band, place in a paper bag with holes, and hang. It is best to dry parsley (and other herbs) away from the sun in a warm and dry location. When the leaves are crisp, you can store your dried parsley for out-of-season use in an airtight container in a cool, dark and dry place.

2021 Year of the Monarda

Monarda is a genus that has a long history of being used as a medicinal herb. As the common name Bee Balm implies, it has also been used to soothe bee stings.

Monarda is a member of the mint family and consists of multiple species, most of which are hardy perennials and all of which are native to certain regions of North America. Summertime flowering on all these species is quite attractive to humans and pollinators.

Native Americans used monarda to make bee balm tea to treat chills and fever.

Monarda's three most common species are didyma, fistulosa and punctate.

Monardo is also known as Bee Balm, a member of the mint family.

Monarda is very attractive to pollinators, especially butterflies and hummingbirds.

Monarda Species:

Monarda punctata, aka Horsemint or Dotted Mint, is somewhat of an unruly native prairie plant characterized by tall unbranched stems topped with rounded clusters of pink or lavender tubular flowers. The stacked combination of speckled flowers and colorful bracts make this distinctive and unusual.

Monarda fistulosa, or wild Bergamot, is one of the species commonly used for medicinal purposes. Being highly aromatic with showy lavender-pink flowers, it is also used as a honey plant.

Monarda didyma (Scarlet Bee Balm) has long been cherished for not only its use for tea but also its ornamental value. The bright scarlet/red flowers of M. didyma are still a part of many ongoing breeding programs with Monarda.

It has been a long road from these native species of Monarda to the prized ornamental cultivars available today. Some of the first hybrids of M. didyma x M. fistulosa produced vibrant flower colors with a more well-behaved plant, but they continued to be plagued by their native attributes of being highly susceptible to mildew, somewhat tall and leggy and had a tendency to spread by rhizomes.

2021 Proven Winners Perennial of the Year: Nepeta 'Cat's Pajamas' Catmint

A purr-fect Catmint for fans of 'Cat's Meow' who love the look but want a smaller scale version. In addition to being a little over half the height, 'Cats Pajamas' also blooms about 2-3 weeks earlier than 'Cat's Meow'. The ball-shaped habit carries long, dark flower stems that hold indigo blue flowers. Unlike older varieties that only produce flowers at the top of the stems, this improved Catmint has blooms from the soil to the tips of the stems. Even when the flowers are past peak, the color of the rosy purple calyxes give your garden an additional splash of color. As an added bonus, the small, aromatic leaves keep deer and rabbits away. Try this shorter stature plant in city gardens or near the front of the border

Compared to the popular 'Millenium', 'Lavender Bubbles' blooms later and is a darker shade of purple. Like other Allium, 'Lavender Bubbles' is carefree, easy to grow, and deer and rabbit resistant.

Alliums are charming plants for the rock or herb garden. When the foliage is bruised, it smells like onions since they are in the onion family. Butterflies and honeybees adore the flowers' sweet nectar but deer and rabbits steer clear of this perennial beauty. Height: 18-24 Inches

Anemone 'Spring Beauty Pink' Japanese Anemone

From the Netherlands comes Spring Beauty Pink a brand new type of Anemone. A hybrid of Anemone sylvestris, its bubblegum pink flowers will encourage you to get in the garden to enjoy its beautiful blossoms. Extremely long blooming, it flowers first appear in spring and continue throughout summer. Delicate looking, but extremely tough, its perfectly pink flowers flutter in the wind attracting all the early pollinators with its nectar. Its emerald leaves mature into attractive mounds.

▶Growing only 12" tall and 15" wide makes the compact plant perfect for smaller gardens, and for the front of the border. It tolerates considerable shade. It looks beautiful in woodland settings and mixed with other perennials in cottage, cutting, and pollinator gardens. It spreads by underground rhizomes and can be used as a ground cover. New plants may grow near the original plant and can be easily transplanted elsewhere.

Columbine is not a fussy plant (as evidenced by those random seedlings you often see poking out of corners in the garden), but there are a few things you can do to make sure they not only grow, but thrive:

- Make sure that your 'dappled shade' has plenty of 'dappled' and not too much 'shade.' Columbine needs light to flower well.
- If you're in a climate with a hotter summer, site Columbine to take advantage of afternoon shade.
- If you don't wish to stake your plants, do not overfeed Columbine. Though they like rich soils, they also grow well in average ones, and will remain bushier if light levels are relatively high and soils are not too fat.
- Water evenly during the first year. Once established, Columbine is more tolerant of occasional drought conditions.
- Cut the foliage to the ground after flowering to rejuvenate the foliage which may be marked with tunnels from leaf miners. Throw that foliage away don't compost it.

Resist the urge to divide your plants if you can help it. Columbine don't enjoy the process and may sulk for a full year.

Nith the addition of 'Chantilly Lace' to the Proven Winners® program, you can be well on your way to a complete shade garden lineup! It is very floriferous when it's in bloom, completely covering the deep green foliage. Goatsbeard is similar in appearance to Astilbe in the garden, but it is more drought tolerant.

▶'Chantilly Lace' will be shorter if grown in full sun, closer to 24" tall, than if grown in shade or a sun-filtered area, where it will grow to a height of 30-32".

▶Though Aruncus tends to be a slow-grower the first couple of seasons, once it is established it puts on a fabulous show year after year. Make sure it has plenty of room to grow when you first plant it; transplanting this species is a very difficult task. This species is native to North America.

Astrantia 'Burgundy Manor' & 'Sparkling Stars White' Masterwort

Astrantias are superb perennials for growing under trees, on a stream bank or in a moist border. They prefer moist soils but will tolerate drier conditions as long as the plants are mulched. For best results grow Astrantias in moist but well-drained soil in partial shade. After flowering, Astrantias can be rejuvenated by cutting them back close to the ground - fresh new foliage and a late crop of flowers are produced soon after. Astrantias don't spread far but they do self seed.

Astrantia major 'Burgundy Manor' is a beautiful variety with ruby-red pincushion flowers with a persistent bract, shading from pink through to greenish-white. It's ideal for growing in containers and makes an excellent cut flower.




