Polygonatum odoratum 'Variegatum'

Variegated Solomon's Seal



Light. Part to full shade

Height. 2 Feet

Uses. This perennial offers high visual impact in shaded areas of borders, woodland gardens, or naturalized areas. Paired white flowers hang from elegant arching stems and contrast with variegated foliage. Sweetly scented.

Maintenance. There are no serious insect or disease problems. Plants may be divided in the spring or fall. It is a very easy perennial to grow and will enhance any shade area. Soil moisture becomes more important as exposure to sun increases.

Hardiness. USDA Zones 3 to 8

Soil. Moist, well-drained soil

Blooms. May-June

PEAR PRESSURE

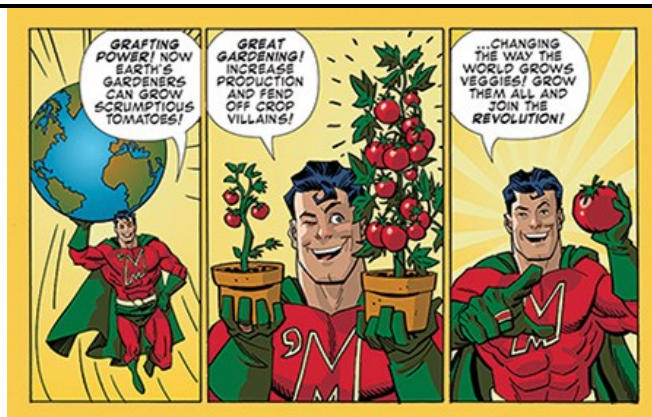


BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND! This spring at Hanson's we are once again carrying pear trees in bare root. Pear trees have been hard to cultivate in our area, due to their very early blooms that are susceptible to frost. When the early blooms are hit by frost, the pears will not be able to grow fruit. Also, we were looking for a hardy pollinator for the 'Ure' Pear, the most reliable pear tree for our area. We believe we have found it with the 'Early Gold' Pear, which is a Canadian introduction and will successfully cross pollinate with the 'Ure' tree. There is still some concern over frost damage, so we suggest planting your trees in an area with good air drainage (like a side hill) and not in low lying areas. We want you to be successful so please keep in mind the risks associated with this type of fruit tree. However, if you like pears—like we do—you may just want to try these out.

Pyrus "Jefgold" - 'Early Gold' Pear - Bloom Date: Early May. Ripening Date: Early August. Use 'Ure' Pear to pollinate. Zones: 2-7. Available in bare root. \$20.00

Pyrus "Ure" - 'Ure' Pear - Bloom Date: Early May. Ripening Date: Mid-August. Use 'Early Gold' Pear to pollinate. Zones: 3-7. Available in bare root. \$20.00





New for 2013 at Hanson's Garden Village, Mighty 'Mato brand grafted tomatoes. Grafting is a natural process that joins the top part of one plant (scion) to the root system of another plant (rootstock) without any genetic modification. As tissues heal, the two plants fuse, combining the rootstock's vigor and disease resistance – for increased water and nutrient uptake for higher yields – with the scion's exceptional fruit quality and flavor.

Benefits of Grafting:

- Stronger, more vigorous plants
- Bigger, better, and longer harvests
- Improved ability to withstand temperature extremes
- Superior defenses against soil-borne diseases and pests, including nematode



IMPROVEMENTS AT HGV

Throughout the off season we have been working at improving operations out here at Hanson's Garden Village.

We have rebuilt 4,000 sq. feet of production benches with wood strips—believing wood construction to be greener than plastic or metal (see pictures to the left).

We are continuing to add more large yellow price signs in each of our retail annual and perennial greenhouses. We are trying to help you, the customer, easily understand our pricing system based on the pot size and color.

We bought a utility vehicle to help less mobile customers reach our more distant locations. This will also help us make quicker runs for growing supplies that we stock in the back storage building and will aid in transferring plants in the nursery to waiting customers.

We have new shelves in the office shop and a better labeling system to help customers locate the products they need for their gardens.

We also made improvements to our heating and irrigation systems. Our heating tube system helps promote better root growth making a stronger plant product for our customers.

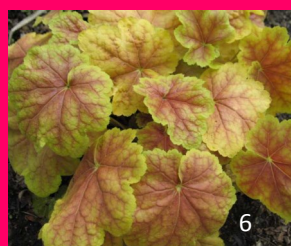
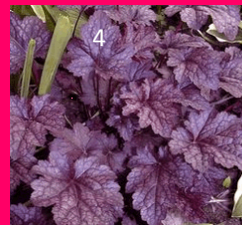


HOT HEUCHERAS

NEW APPLE TREE VARIETIES

Freedom: S-M7 (Semi-Dwarf), mid-late bloomer, disease resistant fruit therefore no spraying needed, cross pollinate with Liberty to try a no spray orchard, good eating apple (1st Picture)

Frost Bite: Standard, mid-late bloomer, extremely cold hardy, small apple, sweet, intense taste, good for cider and cooking, bred in Minnesota in 1936

Liberty: S-M7 (Semi-Dwarf), mid bloomer, crisp and juicy apple, does well without spraying, cross pollinate with Freedom to try a no spray orchard (2nd Picture)

Winecrisp: S-M7 (Semi-Dwarf), mid bloomer, attractive eating and cooking apple, resists scab, late ripening variety (3rd Picture)

Wodarz: Standard, mid bloomer, vigorous and hardy, uneven shaped yellow to pink apple, white, firm, sweet flesh, good for eating and cooking, discovered in North Dakota on a family orchard and jointly released by the family and North Dakota State University

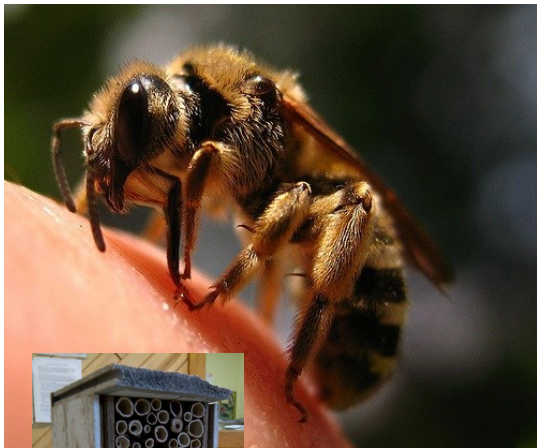

Support Your Local Bees!



Hanson's Garden Village carries locally made Mason bee houses. The drilled style houses are made from re-used and scavenged materials and the tubular style houses interiors are made from invasive Japanese Knotweed. They are \$30.00 each.

Bees are essential for maintaining the integrity, productivity and sustainability of many types of ecosystems. Without bees, many flowering plants would eventually become extinct. The Orchard Mason Bee is the common name of a nonsocial native bee that pollinates our spring fruit trees, flowers and vegetables. It is gentle, does not sting, and does not live in hives because it does not produce honey. In nature it nests within hollow stems, woodpecker drillings and insect holes found in trees or wood scraps. To help these bees (and the pollination of our fruits/vegetables/trees), many gardeners have begun hanging bee homes in their backyard. Bee homes are great because they provide cover and a safe place for mason bees to raise their young.

TREES & SHRUBS OF INTEREST FOR 2013



1. Philadelphus x virginalis - "Snowgoose Mock Orange"

Part shade. Zones: 4-. Height: 5'. Width: 3-5'. Foliage: Green. Bloom: White. Blooms April to May. Fragrant, double white flowers in spring. Plant has a fountain-like growth habit. Useful in naturalized plantings, lawn plantings or as a background. Prune every year after blooming, cutting out oldest wood and surplus shoots at the base. Available in bare root. \$8.00



2. Acer x freemanii 'Bailston' - "Matador Maple"

Full sun. Zones: 4-7. Height: 40-45'. Width: 20-40'. Foliage: Green. Fall foliage: Deep red to orange-red. This cultivar is selected because of its superior habit and fall color. A deeper, more consistent red fall color than other maples. An adaptable tree with an upright, symmetrical form. Gains its fall color a bit later than other cultivars and holds its leaves longer. Available in bare root. \$60.00



3. Physocarpus opulifolius 'Donna May' - "Little Devil"

Full sun. Zones: 3-7. Height: 3-4'. Width: 3-4'. Foliage: Red/purple. Flower: Creamy white. Bred by David Zlesak, a former HGV employee and current Assistant Professor of Horticulture at UW-River Falls. This "cute little devil" will add deep burgundy foliage color to your garden in a compact, easy to grow and maintain shrub. An exciting improvement to ninebark selections, Little Devil is great for every garden but especially useful where low maintenance is desired, as it needs little to no pruning and is free from pest and disease issues. The dark foliage is beautifully offset by button-like white-pink flowers in June. Available in 2 gallon or 3 gallon pots. \$22.00 or \$26.50



4. Physocarpus opulifolius 'Jefam' - "Amber Jubilee"

Full sun. Zones: 2-7. Height: 5-6'. Width: 4'. Foliage: Yellow orange, green. Fall foliage: Red and purple. Flower: White. Selected for its striking foliage in glowing tones of orange, yellow and gold. Rounded and dense in habit, this shrub with its bold array of colors will stand out in your garden border or make for an eye-catching hedge. Delicate white blooms are produced in spring, and fall foliage is highlighted with tones of red and purple, making this ninebark appealing over the entire season. Available in 2 gallon pots. \$22.00



5. Prunus nigra 'Princess Kay' - "Princess Kay Plum"

Full sun. Zones: 2-6. Height: 12-15'. Width: 10-15'. Foliage: Green. Fall color: Reddish purple. Flower: White. An ornamental plum with fragrant, white double flowers. The tree form is oval with a somewhat open informal branching habit. It is a small tree that produces very pleasant and fragrant double white blooms in early May, before the leaves emerge. Not tolerant of poorly drained soils or extremely droughty soils. Available in bare root. \$40.00



6. Prunus sargentii 'Hokkaido Normandale' - "Spring Wonder Sargent Cherry"

Full sun. Zones 4-8. Height: 20-25'. Width: 18-24'. Fall foliage: Yellow, orange or red. Flower: Pink. This upright vase-shaped tree is native to Japan and blooms in early May with single pink flowers. The bark is a polished, reddish brown. New growth is purplish while the summer foliage a dark shiny green. Good looking tree with three season appeal. Available in bare root. \$35.00



7. Syringa reticulata 'Bailnce' - "Snowdance Japanese Tree Lilac"

Full sun. Zones 3-7. Height: 18'. Width: 20'. Foliage: Dark Green. Flower: Creamy White. Exceptionally heavy bloom. Snowdance flowers annually and begins flowering at an earlier age than the species. Large, fragrant panicles of creamy white bloom in June. This sterile variety produces no untidy, brown seedheads. A pest and disease free lilac tree for residential use. Available in bare root. \$50.00
